





The BID continues to develop iniatives and plans that support the economic recovery of our town centre. This report highlights how we have supported you through these difficult times and how we plan to move Stratford forward.



STRATFORD THRIVE

In 2022 we were successful in our application for external funding through Newham Council and in March we received £250,000. The funding was used to develop and support a bespoke programme called Stratford Thrive which consisted of 4 core pillars: Community Building, Safer & Welcoming, Business Benefits. The programme was delivered in addition to our ongoing services.

Below you can see a breakdown of the initiatives we continue to run in support of our mission to move Stratford forward and create a safer and more welcoming place for business, residents, and visitors.

2022 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

Community Building

- 7 free community events run through the year driving additional footfall into the town centre, with 2 more planned in 2023
- 2 editions of our free magazines produced and distributed to over 20,000 households across Stratford, one in Spring and one in Winter, offering free advertising space for BID members

Safer & welcoming

- Plans to implement creative lighting in hot spot areas, to help make Stratford a welcoming and safer environment for locals, employees and visitors
- Additional security officer in place to support our community events and regular patrols of the area

Business Benefits

- Logistics audit to assess local business needs and move towards an increased use of sustainable transport modes
- Free Federation of Small Business memberships offered to all BID members
- Developing a training and mentoring programme for young residents who have been impacted by the pandemic
- Research conducted to understand the student population in Stratford and how they can play a role in boosting the local economy in the original town centre
- Business Health Clinics due to launch in April to help businesses identify savings on their bills



BUSINESS ESSENTIALS

Providing essential business support to you is our key focus. We are lobbying Central Government to introduce appropriate measures and offer you direct support to protect your business.

2022 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Free training programmes to our members in-person on a monthly basis
- Discounted & subsidised waste rates through our partnership

2023 PLANS

- Plans to run a masterclass programme for our BID members, highlighting the importance of sustainability and how they can adapt cost effectively
- with First Mile with a recycling rate of 53%
- Continue to lobby and campaign to government on behalf of the local business community



SAFER STRATFORD

With safety being a key priority in Stratford, we will continue to monitor the evolving situation to ensure that employers, staff, shoppers and visitors are kept safe.

2022 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- 13 prolific offenders identified
- · 8 issued with an Exclusion Notice by the BCRP
- · 3 issued with further inunctions from the police
- £25,282 of goods recovered (96.59% recovery rate)
- 9 joint patrols conducted with Council, MPS. BTP and BID
- 15 hot spots areas visited regularly
- · 20 rough sleepers engaged and referred to services
- · Safer Stratford Nights implemented (bi-monthly meeting for

night-time economy)

- Key meetings implemented with security teams to improve intelligence
- Safer Stratford Partnership monthly meeting with relevant agencies to discuss youth violence and identify solutions
- WAVE and Ask for Angela training delivered to 172 staff
- Safer Stratford BCRP nominated as finalist at the Outstanding Security Partnership Awards

2023 PLANS

- More WAVE and Ask for Angela training so that the whole of the NTE can help prevent vulnerabilities exploitation
- · Op. Make Safe MPS training on child exploitation
- · Op. Bank training for banks on crime prevention
- Radio channel set up between all partners
- Design of training for retailers on vulnerabilities
- Shoplifting policy for Stratford
- More work on travelling offenders



PROMOTING AND ACTIVATING



The BID is promoting the area's unique identity and encouraging visitors and residents to explore the town centre and to contribute to the local economy.

2022 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Over 2,000 unique web visitors each month, giving our BID more visibility online
- Launched blog section on our website to provide members with guest slots and links back to their own website
- Landed coverage in The Guardian and Evening Standard twice in 2022, promoting Stratford Original as a destination
- Use Twitter and Instagram to promote our BID members, share valuable information and actively engage
- Update our BID members monthly via our monthly digital and printed newsletter
- Supported 10th anniversary of Olympic and Paralympic Games by running free sports events for kids in summer holidays
- Quarterly editorial column secured in the Newham Recorder
 which we offer to our BID members
- Ran a number of **seasonal events** for the community attracting over 450 people each time

2023 PLANS

- Celebrate Chinese New Year in partnership with Chinese
 Overseas, one of our BID members
- · Continued support of our free community magazine
- Implement member wide marketing meetings to explore partnership opportunities, share learnings and marketing tips to support small businesses



ENHANCING STRATFORD

While the continuous investment and development in Stratford is ongoing, the BID is keen to ensure the town centre remains a welcoming place for everybody to enjoy. We are delivering a number of initiatives to make Stratford more attractive

2022 KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Public Places for Rest and Play: installed a series of benches, table tennis and playful floor graphics across four locations
- Commissioned a series of deep cleaning sessions covering approx. 2,000m2 - more scheduled for Spring 2023
- Additional planters and seasonal greening. Plus maintenance of pocket gardens and our Adopt-a-planter scheme
- Monthly Dr Bike Services & Dr Bike Social expanding our services due to popular demand
- Campaigns around **bike safety** and **Mark Your Bike events** with 46 bikes registered to the National Database
- Responded to cleaning and maintenance issues within our area, from litter collection, bins relocation, to pest control emergency and more
- Continuous engagement with local residents and groups, including representation to the Park Panel (Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park)
- Facilitated arts interventions such as Typoetry which involved local businesses
- Raised additional £36K of external funding to support projects

2023 PLANS

- Continue our work for more Creative lighting to enhance walking experience
- Greening Stratford, advocating for more trees and green spaces
- Targeted Anti-litter campaign
- Local development directory what is coming in Stratford
- Continue supporting active travel

- Support space activation with art & heritage interventions
- Continue our representation of consultations on new developments
- Working with LB Newham, LLDC and other stakeholders on Stratford Vision, Innovation District, Alice Billings House and High Street Cultural Strategy
