
How does it work?








TRAINING SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED

WOMEN'S SAFETY CONSULTATION

We're pleased to announce that London Legacy Development Corporation (LLDC) has launched a consultation on the safety of women and girls on Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park and across our wider Mayoral Development Corporation area.

Following the tragic murder of Sarah Everard earlier this year, LLDC has been working to identify ways in which we can **improve safety** in the Park. Another tragic murder recently – of teacher Sabina Nessa in south London – has again brought national attention to this critical issue.

By listening to the experiences of women and girls who use the Park and surrounding area, they can understand any safety concerns that you might have. The feedback allows them to prioritise improvements, while ensuring the future design, scrutiny and development of new LLDC neighbourhoods explicitly considers safety issues.
